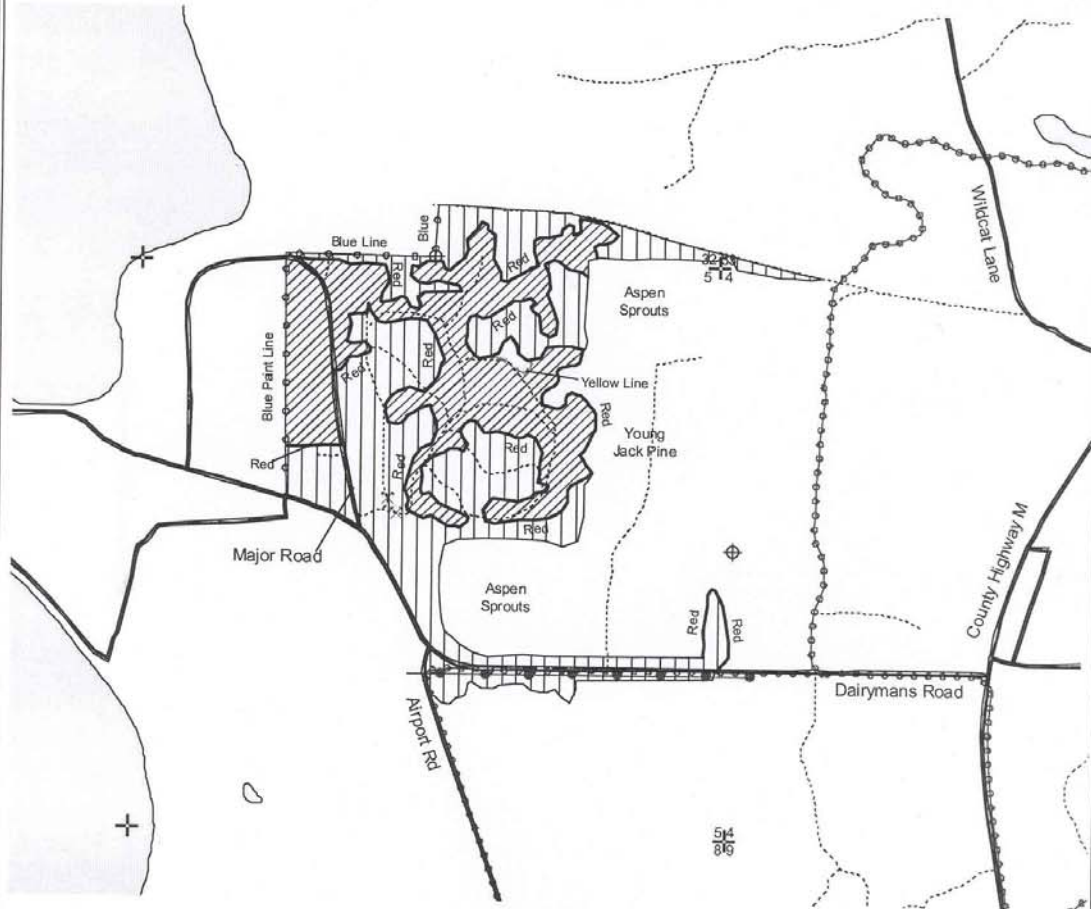

Special Conditions:

1. Cutting must be concurrent for all species to be harvested.⁽⁹⁾
2. Decking will be permitted along the snowmobile trail only between April 1st and December 1st. All wood must be removed by December 1st.⁽¹⁸⁾
3. Snowmobile trails must be kept free of debris and left in good condition for vehicle traffic at all times.⁽¹⁸⁾
