



2009 Air Reporting System Introduction



The 2009 Air Reporting System used for reporting 2008 air emissions has changed for the version people used in 2008. The changes you will see to the look and feel of the program will be negligible.



Changes

- The Air Reporting System is now a component of a larger database called the Wisconsin Air Reporting Program
- ARS will look the same but you should be able to do more

What you do not see is that the Air Reporting System, ARS, is now a component of a large Air Management Oracle database called the Wisconsin Air Reporting Program (WARP). Because ARS is now part of an Oracle database, ARS has become simpler and more powerful.

What has not changed

- Security- Still need to have a WAMS ID
- Format of the pages-generally the same
- Still due on March 2, 2009

ARS has not changed in a few areas. The security has not changed. You will need a WAMS ID and reporting authorization before you can report for your facility. The format of the ARS pages has also not changed significantly. Finally, the reporting deadline has remained the same.

What has changed

- No Reporting Requirements screen – WARP sets flags behind the scene
- Calculate emissions during your computer session

You will not see a reporting requirements screen this year. The reporting requirements screen is not necessary because WARP now determines what screens need to be visited by the user. The other significant change was that you can now click a button and have ARS calculate emissions. You can see the calculated emissions before you submit data to DNR.
