## 2010 Urban Forestry Grants



**W**hat kinds of projects are funded? Urban forestry is considered to be tree management, operations and education within cities, villages and other areas of concentrated development. This year, priority will be given to Emerald Ash Borer projects including tree inventories, readiness plans, ordinances, staff training and public awareness. Other types of eligible projects include: urban forest management plans urban forestry training, public education workshops, training materials, fliers, planting, pruning or removing trees, celebrating Arbor Day and much more!

**Grants range from \$1,000 to \$25,000.** Grant recipients must match the grant dollar-for-dollar with cash, labor, services, supplies, equipment or facilities provided by the recipient or donated by a third party or volunteer. Grants are not provided up front -- upon project completion and approval, the sponsor requests reimbursement for 50 percent of eligible costs up to the approved

amount of the grant award. Nonprofit organizations can request an advance of half of their grant award.

**Who can apply?** Wisconsin cities, villages, towns, counties, tribal governments, and 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations are eligible for urban forestry grants.

**I'm interested. What next?** Fill out and return this "Intent to Apply" postmarked by Sept. 4, 2009. This is NOT a grant application. Submitting this form does not obligate you to apply for a grant, but does ensure that you will receive an urban forestry grant application packet.

The deadline for submitting a completed grant application is October 5, 2009. Those who are selected to receive a grant are notified in early December, and the grant period runs from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010.

**I need help...** DNR regional urban forestry coordinators are available to assist you in project and application development. If you would like more information before you apply, contact the regional urban forestry coordinator for your area.

**2010 update...** The start up grant application is available again for projects limited to one or two urban forestry activities. The start up application has a maximum grant award of \$5,000 and is targeted for communities that would like to start or restart an urban forestry management program.

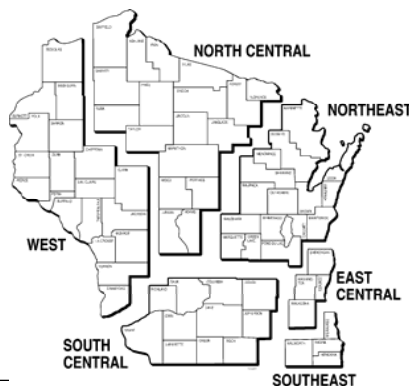
