**Timber Wolf Alliance (TWA)** is pleased to announce Dr. James Halfpenny's Wildlife Tracking Skills Workshop. The workshop offers in-depth tracking skills training to all enthusiasts who wish not only to understand wildlife tracking, but also to learn about large and medium-sized carnivores. This two-day workshop will cover track and sign identification, understanding footprints, and interpreting gait with an emphasis on reading trails to understand animal behavior and ecology. The workshop includes classroom lectures and in-the-field training. **This workshop meets the tracking qualifications for becoming a DNR Volunteer Carnivore Tracker assisting with the winter wolf counts.**

**The workshop fee is \$165** (\$155 TWA members).

This includes registration, meals, and all workshop materials. LODGING IS NOT INCLUDED. Payment must be received in full before confirmation of registration is made.

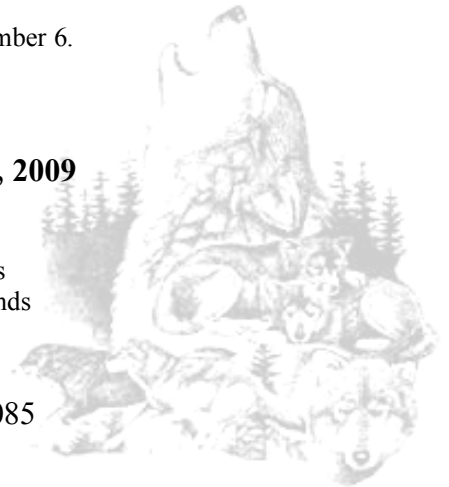

Dr. James Halfpenny is one of the world's foremost professional wildlife trackers and a widely renowned scientist and educator. Dr. Halfpenny is the founder of A Naturalist's World, and educational tracking adventure company, and is a former research associate at the Institute of Arctic and Alpine Research at the University of Colorado. He was an instructor at the National Outdoor Leadership School and served as director of the Mountain Research Station. He has taught tracking since 1967. In addition to numerous scientific and popular articles, he is author of *A Field Guide to Mammal Tracking in North America* and *Winter: An Ecological Handbook*.
