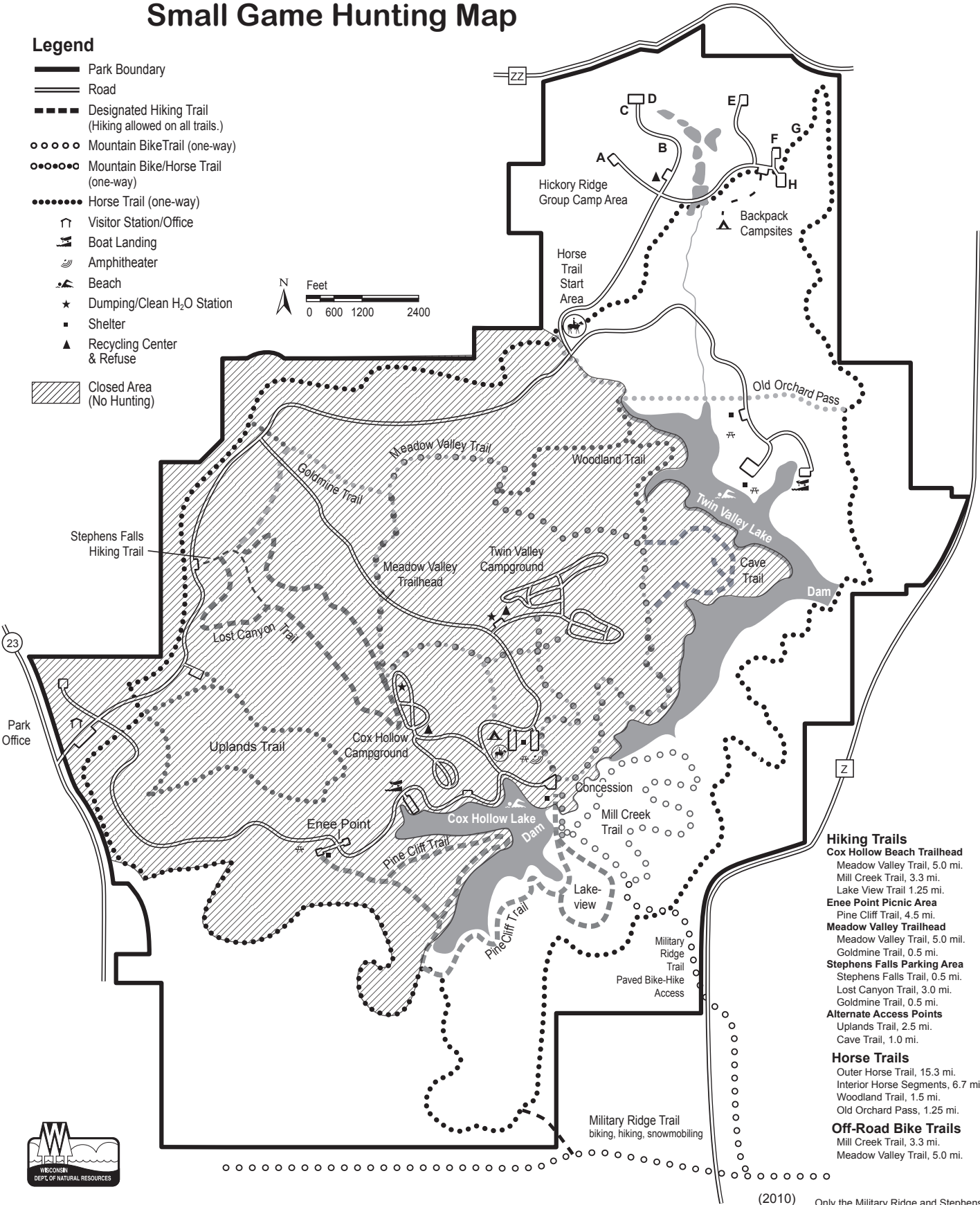


# Governor Dodge State Park

Notice: Per s. NR 10.275(3) Wis. Adm. Code, **the hunter must carry this permit at all times while small game or migratory bird hunting in Governor Dodge State Park.** This is not a complete set of laws. See the *2011 Wisconsin Small Game Hunting Regulations* and *2011 Wisconsin Migratory Bird Regulations* for more information on regulations, seasons, and hunting hours.

1. To be eligible to hunt small game or migratory game birds in Governor Dodge State Park, a hunter must first obtain the appropriate State Park Hunting Permit issued at the park in addition to the appropriate hunting licenses, permits and stamps for the species being hunted (Refer to the *2011 Small Game Hunting Regulations* and *2011 Wisconsin Migratory Bird Regulations* for license requirements).
2. Small game hunting in the park is permitted from **November 1 through December 15** EXCEPT where statewide or regional seasons end earlier for specific species (i.e. duck hunting). See the *2011 Wisconsin Small Game Hunting Regulations* and *2011 Wisconsin Migratory Bird Regulations* for season dates. Possession of loaded or uncased firearms is prohibited on November 18 unless waterfowl hunting.
3. Shotgun, muzzleloading shotgun, or bow only. Use of rifles and pistols is prohibited for small game hunting. All firearms must be unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case and bows must be unstrung or enclosed within a carrying case when in a motor vehicle or within a closed area of the park. NOTE: Muzzleloaders are considered unloaded if the cap is removed from a cap lock muzzleloader or the flash pan is cleaned on a flintlock muzzleloader; the ball and powder may remain in the barrel.
4. Daily hunting hours in the park will open 1/2 hour before sunrise. Check the *2011 Wisconsin Small Game Hunting Regulations* pamphlet for specific times. All hunting ends at **12 NOON** each day. No entry is allowed into the park earlier than one hour before the opening hunting time.
5. Many areas of the park are posted as closed areas (see map). Wounded animals moving into the closed area may not be pursued by the hunter. Park rangers must be informed by the hunter of the location of any wounded animal within the closed area. Park rangers will evaluate the situation and may authorize the hunter to recover the animal.
6. All parking and traffic regulations apply during the hunting season. Vehicles shall be operated only on established roads and parking is permitted only in established lots and on shoulders of established roads. Vehicles parked on road shoulders must be completely off the paved road surface.
7. **It is illegal to hunt within 50 feet of the roadway's center or discharge a firearm or shoot an arrow from a bow from or across a park road. It is illegal to shoot within 100 yards of a building devoted to human occupancy. No discharge of a firearm is permitted outside of the designated hunting area.**

8. Small game hunting is allowed by permit only. All eligible hunters, including campers, must register at the park office EACH DAY before hunting. All required licenses, permits and stamps must be obtained before hunting in the park. Migratory bird hunters must be HIP certified.
9. The use of dogs for small game and migratory bird hunting is permitted within the designated small game hunting areas.
10. Park admission stickers are required on all vehicles that enter the park (\$7/day or \$25/annual for vehicles with Wisconsin license plates; \$10/day or \$35/annual for vehicles without Wisconsin license plates).
11. Additional small game hunting rules and regulations are included in the *2011 Wisconsin Small Game Hunting Regulations* pamphlet and the *2011 Wisconsin Migratory Bird Regulations*.
12. Bag Limits and possession limits for small game and migratory game bird hunting at Governor Dodge State Park are the same as in the areas surrounding the park.
13. Species authorized for hunting at Governor Dodge State Park include **crow, pheasant, raccoon, fox (red and gray), coyote, cottontail rabbit, squirrel (gray and fox), duck, Canada goose, and woodcock.**
14. **Attention:** Deer hunting at Governor Dodge State Park will take place November 19 through December 11. During this time all hunters, except waterfowl hunters, will be required to meet the blaze orange requirements listed on page 9 of the *2011 Wisconsin Small Game Hunting Regulations* pamphlet.
15. **Remember, non-hunting park visitors are also enjoying the park during hunting season. Make sure you know where closed areas, campgrounds, buildings, and trails are located to minimize user conflicts.**
