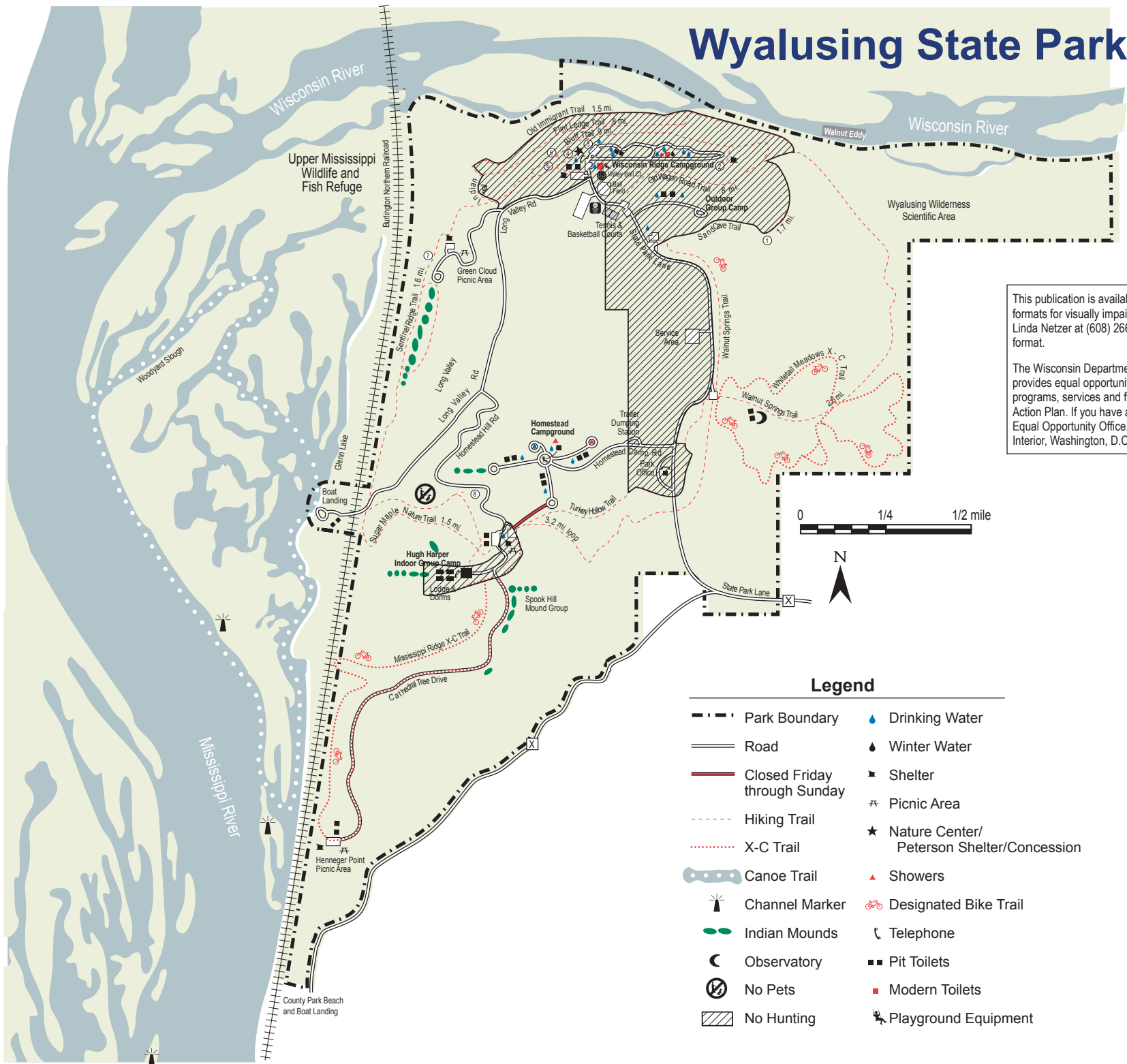
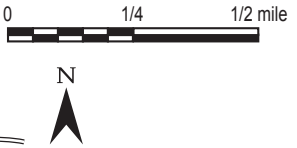

WYALUSING STATE PARK 2009 DEER SEASON SPECIAL REGULATIONS – DMU 73A

(Refer to the 2009 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations pamphlet for additional regulations.)

Only holders of a 2009 Park Access Permit for deer hunting in Wyalusing State Park (Deer Management Unit 73A) may deer hunt in the park. On all vehicles that enter the park, Park admission stickers are required (\$7.00 per day or \$25.00 annually for residents; \$10.00 per day or \$35.00 annually for non-residents). Hunters are encouraged to purchase stickers prior to opening morning to avoid delays at the office. Contact the park office for camping information.

Season Dates:

- Wyalusing State Park will be open to deer gun hunting November 21 – 29, 2009. **NOTE: The park will not be open to firearm hunting during the statewide Nov. 30 - Dec. 9 muzzleloader season, the Oct. 15-18 antlerless gun hunt, or the December 10 – 13, 2009 antlerless gun hunt.**
- Wyalusing State Park is not open to archery hunting.

Weapon Restrictions:

- All legal firearms including rifles, shotguns, muzzleloaders, and handguns may be used to hunt deer in the park during the November 21 – 29, 2009 firearm season. Please see the 2009 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations pamphlet for definitions of legal deer hunting firearms. All firearms must be unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case in or on a motor vehicle or within a closed area of the park.
- Note: Scope restrictions on muzzleloaders do not apply during this hunt.

Tagging Options:

- **Herd Control Management Unit regulations apply in unit 73A for the 2009 gun deer hunting season** (see the 2009 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations booklet for Herd Control Unit tagging requirements).
- Gun hunters that receive a 2009 Park Access Permit for unit 73A may use their Gun Buck Deer Carcass Tag to tag one buck during the open gun season listed above.
- Antlerless deer may be harvested per Antlerless Deer Carcass Tag valid in Herd Control and Earn-a-Buck units. One comes free with each Gun Deer Hunting License.
- Additional Antlerless Herd Control Carcass Tags valid in Herd Control and Earn-a-Buck units are \$2 each (for residents and non-residents) and may be purchased online, by phone or at any license sales location.

Hunting Hours:

- Hunting hours are found in the 2009 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations (pages 52 – 53). Hunters may enter the park up to one hour before the legal hunting hours begin for that day.

Deer Registration:

- Deer will not be registered at Wyalusing State Park. Deer must be registered in the adjacent unit. A list of registration stations is available at DNR Service Centers or on the DNR Website (dnr.wi.gov)
- When registering a deer harvested from Wyalusing State Park, indicate “73A” as the DMU of Kill.

Additional Park Regulations:

- Some areas of the park will be posted as closed areas (see map on back). **No hunting on or shooting into the closed areas is allowed.** A wounded deer moving into the closed area may not be pursued by the hunter and deer may not be driven from closed areas. Park rangers must be informed by the hunter of the location of any wounded animal within the closed areas.
- All park regulations and traffic restrictions shall apply during the season. Contact the park office for more information.
- Group Hunting is restricted to persons in possession of a 2009 Park Access Permit for unit 73A. Persons who have filled their carcass tags may continue to engage in group hunting, provided they have their unit 73A Park Access Permit and deer hunting license in their possession.
- **Disabled Hunters** must also be in possession of a Park Access Permit for Unit 73A and, with a Class A or C Disabled Permit, are authorized to hunt from a legally parked vehicle along roadways in areas open to deer hunting in the park.
- Tree stands and ground blinds must be portable, removed from the property each day, and cannot damage trees (no screw-in foot pegs). This rule does not apply to blinds made entirely of dead vegetation, a practice that is strongly discouraged on state park property.
- All tree stands that are not occupied during legal hunting hours shall have the owner’s customer ID number or name and address attached to the tree stand in a manner that is visible to a person on the ground.
- Ground blinds used on DNR lands must have a minimum of 144 square inches of highly visible blaze orange material that is visible 360 degrees around the blind, any time a gun deer season is in effect.
- No fires are permitted while hunting. Be sure all smoking material is extinguished. All laws and administrative codes related to hunting and conduct in state parks is strictly enforced.
- No other species of wildlife may be hunted within the park.
- All hunters should be aware of other recreational users within the park. Not all people will be wearing blaze orange, so be sure of your target and beyond!
