

SUBJECT: LAND ACQUISITION AND PROJECT BOUNDARY MODIFICATION – TICHIGAN WILDLIFE AREA – RACINE COUNTY

FOR: DECEMBER 2008 BOARD MEETING

SUMMARY: The Department has obtained an option to purchase 119.00 acres of land from Thomas and Sharon Cerny for \$685,000 for the Tichigan Wildlife Area in Racine County. The item is being submitted because the price exceeds \$150,000 and 49 acres fall outside the project boundary.

Additionally, the Department has obtained the right-of-first-refusal on the Cerny's remaining acreage of about 70 acres, excluding their home and barns. The property is located in northwest Racine County about 26 miles from Milwaukee and 21 miles from Racine. It adjoins state owned lands along the eastern boundary. Most of the eastern portion of the parcel is in the project boundary and the western 40-acre is outside of the project boundary.

The Tichigan Wildlife Area consists of a rolling landscape with upland and wetland habitat, with the Tichigan Marsh in the center. The wetlands range from wet meadows to shallow marshes and disturbed areas with reed canary grass. The shrub-carr areas include areas with red-osier dogwood and willow and disturbed areas with buckthorn. The upland areas include agricultural fields planted in crop for wildlife that will eventually be planted into native grassland cover or hardwoods. Tichigan Creek, a Class III trout stream, flows through the southern portion of the property to Tichigan Lake. The wildlife area is used extensively for hunting, especially for deer, waterfowl, pheasant, and turkey. Other types of recreation pursued here are trapping, wildlife watching, hiking, photography, canoeing, fishing, snowmobile trails, and geocaching. The area is managed for grasslands and wetlands for waterfowl and upland game birds.

The Tichigan Marsh in pre-settlement times was part of the Fox River system and formed an extensive emergent marsh. It was an area that supported a variety of wildlife species including: waterfowl, deer, muskrats, wetland birds, and songbirds. As settlers moved in, the landscape changed (e.g., ditching, roads, farming, etc.) and in 1838, a dam was built on the Fox River in Waterford, approximately four miles downstream from the current wildlife area. The dam resulted in the 351-acre lake that abuts the marsh and the wildlife area and that reduced the size of the marsh.

Purchase of the 119 acres will provide area for public outdoor recreation as well as important wildlife habitat for game and non-game species.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board approve the purchase of 119 acres of land for \$685,000 for Tichigan Wildlife Area and approve modification of the project boundary to include the entire parcel.



1. PARCEL DESCRIPTION:

Location: The property is located in Racine County two miles north of the City of Waterford in the Town of Waterford.

Land Description: The topography of the parcel varies significantly with the highest areas of elevation being located at the southeast and northwest corners of the property and the lowest areas of elevation throughout the lowland and wetland areas.

2. JUSTIFICATION:

The Department proposes to purchase 119 acres from Thomas and Sharon Cerny for the Tichigan Wildlife Area. Additionally, the Department has obtained the right-of-first-refusal on the remaining acreage to exclude their home and barns. The property, of which over 60% falls within the project boundary, is located in the northwestern corner of the Town of Waterford in northwest Racine County and is about 26 miles from Milwaukee and 21 miles from Racine. It adjoins state-owned lands along the eastern boundary. All but nine acres of the eastern portion of the parcel is in the project boundary and the western 40 acres is outside of the project boundary.

The Tichigan Wildlife Area consists of a rolling landscape with upland and wetland habitat, with the Tichigan Marsh in the center. The wetlands range from wet meadows to shallow marshes and disturbed areas with reed canary grass. The shrub-carr areas include areas with red-osier dogwood and willow and disturbed areas with buckthorn. The upland areas include agricultural fields planted in crop for wildlife that will eventually be planted into native grassland cover or hardwoods. Tichigan Creek, a Class III trout stream, flows through the southern portion of the property to Tichigan Lake. The wildlife area is used extensively for hunting, especially for deer, waterfowl, pheasant, and turkey. The Tichigan Marsh is listed as a Natural Area-2 (NA-2) by the Southeastern Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC) in the natural area report, A Regional Natural Areas And Critical Species Habitat Protection and Management Plan for Southeast Wisconsin. The NA-2 designation represents a habitat community that has county or multi-county significance. Tichigan Marsh is the largest emergent marsh in Racine County. The report also recommends that the state acquire the remaining portion of the emergent marsh for preservation. The marsh continues to provide habitat for waterfowl, deer, wetland birds, songbirds, and pheasants.

The Department recommends the acquisition of the Cerny parcel to provide opportunities for public recreation, consolidate state ownership, allow for wildlife management and protect the site from development incompatible with the goals of the project. The Department will modify the project boundary to include the area that fall outside of the boundary if so approved by the Natural Resources Board at its December 2008 meeting.
