SUMMARY:



Retirement Resolution

Eric T Amlie is retiring from the Department of Natural Resources on July 20, 2009 after completing 30 years of service to the State of Wisconsin. Eric joined state service on July 17, 1979.

Eric began his career with the State of Wisconsin as an electronics technician. At that time, monitoring instrumentation was relatively primitive and did not contain computers. Due to many moving parts, the monitors required significant preventative maintenance. Data were also collected manually, rather than digitally.

Eric was responsible for operating and maintaining sulfur dioxide, total suspended particulate and PM10 monitors. He also repaired, maintained, and audited meteorological equipment as well as monitoring support equipment.

Eric's major contribution to the Department is his dedicated service to maintaining a highly technical network of instruments that produce reliable, accurate data. His career-long efforts supported the Department's mission to preserve, protect, effectively manage, and maintain Wisconsin's natural resources.

WHEREAS, Eric T Amlie has served the people of the State of Wisconsin faithfully and well in the performance of duties and has thus earned the commendation due an exemplary public employee;
