

**SUBJECT: EASEMENT ACQUISITION AND DONATION - STATEWIDE NATURAL AREA - ROCK COUNTY**

**FOR: DECEMBER 2007 BOARD MEETING**

**TO BE PRESENTED BY:** Richard Steffes

**SUMMARY:** The Department proposes to purchase a 62.25-acre easement at a cost of \$93,800 from John VanAltena and Constance Brouillette for the Statewide Natural Area program in Rock County. The item requires Board review and action because it is a partial donation of easement value from the landowner. The appraised value of the easement is \$124,500 and the partial donation is \$30,700.

The conservation easement property is known as Koshkonong Corners Natural Area located in northern Rock County in the Town of Milton just east of the existing Fair Meadows State Natural Area and approximately one-quarter mile west of State Highway 26. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Recovery Acquisition Fund will provide 75% of the easement cost and the remaining 25% will be provided by the landowner via a partial donation of value. Thus, there is no cost to the Department for this easement purchase.

Acquisition of a conservation easement on 62.25-acres owned by John P. VanAltena, Jr. and Constance Brouillette property is a priority for the preservation and management of a the state's largest population of the rare eastern prairie fringed orchid (*Platanthera leucophaea*). The eastern prairie fringed orchid (EPFO) is listed as a federally threatened and state endangered species. According to the EPFO Federal Recovery Plan, this orchid species has declined more than 70% from original county records in the United States. A permanent conservation easement will protect the site from incompatible uses, and ensure that the site is managed for long-term orchid survival.

The Statewide Natural Area program was established in 1972 to protect the best remaining examples of Wisconsin's native vegetation as well as habitat for endangered and threatened plants and animals. Natural areas will help protect the natural diversity of the landscape and preserve for future generations a living history of the past.

The purchase of a conservation easement on 62.25 acres of the VanAltena/Brouillette property will aid in the recovery of the eastern prairie fringed orchid and its habitat. Acquisition of the easement aids in protecting the natural values of the site, allows for natural area management, and protects the site from development incompatible with the goals of the Statewide Natural Area program.



JUSTIFICATION:

The Department proposes to purchase a 62.25-acre easement at a cost of \$93,800 from John Van Altena and Constance Brouillette for the Statewide Natural Area program in Rock County. The conservation easement property is located in northern Rock County in the Town of Milton located just east of the existing Fair Meadows State Natural Area and approximately one-quarter mile west of State Highway 26. It is a partial donation of easement value from the landowner as the actual appraised value of the easement is \$124,500. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Recovery Acquisition Fund will provide 75% of the easement cost and the remaining 25% will be donated in the form of easement rights by the landowner. Thus, there is no cost to the Department for this easement purchase from state funds.

Acquisition of a conservation easement on 62.25 acres owned by John P. VanAltena, Jr. and Constance Brouillette is a priority for the preservation and management of a the state's largest population of the rare eastern prairie fringed orchid (*Platanthera leucophaea*). The eastern prairie fringed orchid (EPFO) is listed as a federally threatened and state endangered species. According to the EPFO Federal Recovery Plan, this orchid species has declined more than 70% from original county records in the United States. A permanent conservation easement will protect the site from incompatible uses, and ensure that the site is managed for long-term orchid survival.



The Statewide Natural Area program was established in 1972 to protect the best remaining examples of Wisconsin's native vegetation as well as habitat for endangered and threatened plants and animals. Natural areas will help protect the natural diversity of the landscape and preserve for future generations a living history of the past.

The property provides a large amount of contiguous wet and wet-mesic prairie for the orchid, and for its critical pollinators. The size and the condition of the property also allow for prescribed fire, which is critical for the plant's life cycle. Without active management and the control of invasive species like buckthorn and reed canary grass, the biological diversity of this habitat can quickly degrade, and the eastern prairie fringed orchid can disappear.

The conservation easement will allow for and encourages deer harvest. Controlling the deer population is important because a high population can cause damage to vegetation and, in particular, the eastern prairie fringed orchid. Forty-three acres of the property are under a Managed Forest Law agreement, and six acres are enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program.

The Department recommends the purchase of a conservation easement on 62.25 acres of the VanAltena Brouillette property to aid in the recovery of the eastern prairie fringed orchid and its habitat. Acquisition of the easement aids in protecting the natural values of the site, allows for natural area management, and protects the site from development incompatible with the goals of the Statewide Natural Area program.










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# Altena & Brouillette Rev Trust Property

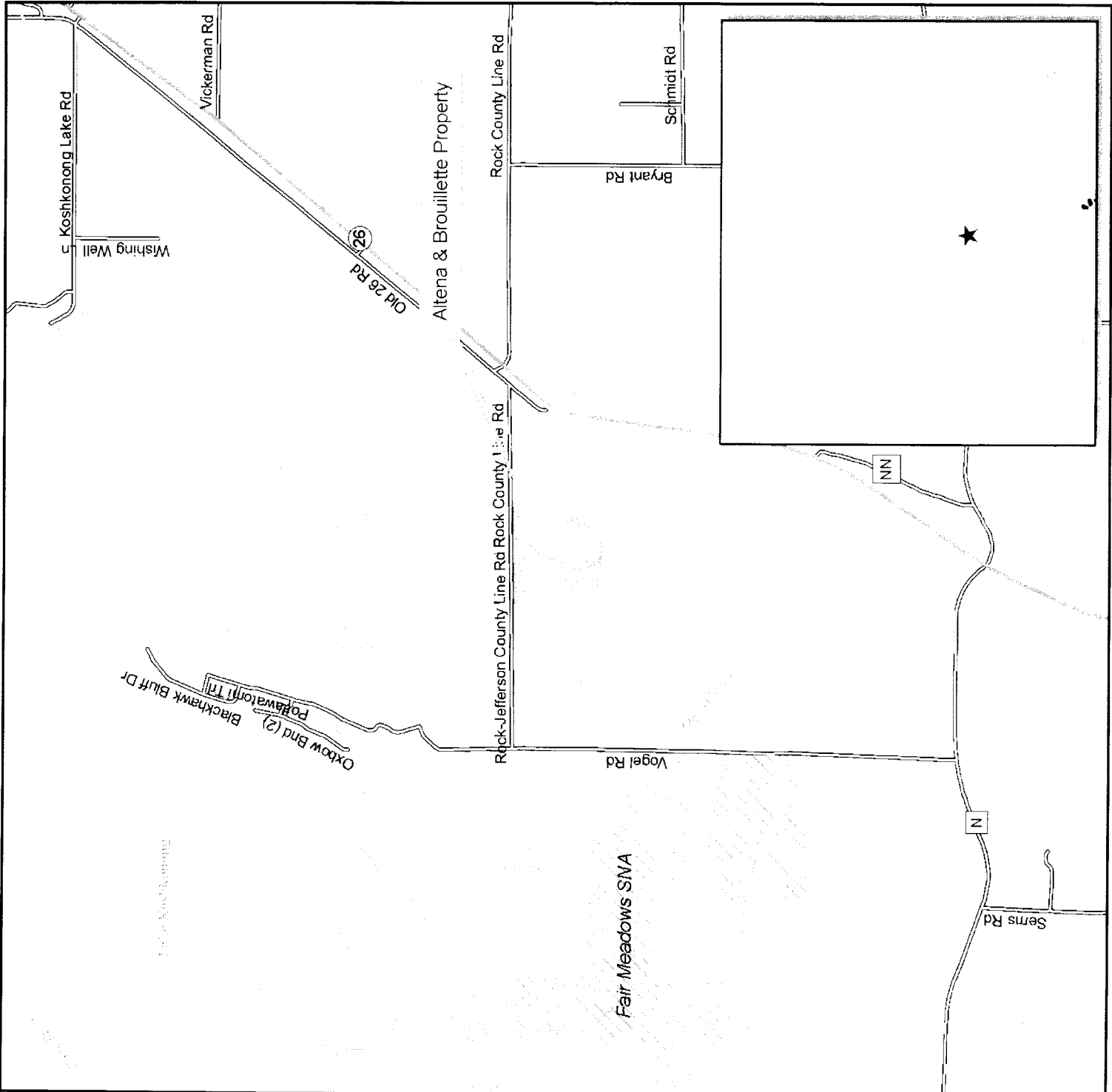
