



Retirement Resolution

Edward Miller, an Air Management Supervisor in the Southeast Region Air Program retired on September 14, 2007. He completed more than 33 years of dedicated public service.

Ed obtained a Bachelor and Master of Science degrees in Engineering from the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee. During his post-graduate study, he performed initial air quality data measurements near the expressways in Milwaukee. He is a registered professional engineer in Wisconsin.

Ed began his career as an Environmental Engineer in the Air Quality Monitoring program in the Southeast District, Milwaukee in September, 1974. He was promoted to the Supervisor of the Air Monitoring Section in the Southeast District in November, 1978. During the next 29 years, he directed the Air Quality Monitoring program in the Southeast Region and was responsible for improvements in efficiency and consistent quality that gained national recognition of the Air Quality Monitoring program as one of the best in the country. His setting up an automated data acquisition system reduced employee hours traveling to check monitoring stations.

Ed's work on the Lake Michigan Ozone Study was crucial in assuring that the major public health issue in the state was dealt with properly. He worked with federal officials in setting up a bioterrorism monitoring program that received national recognition.

Throughout his career, he has been a great friend to all of his colleagues in the department. He received high praise from his supervisors for his effectiveness in performance of his job. Ed has always conducted himself with integrity and has been a credit to the public image of the department.

WHEREAS, Edward Miller has served the people of the State of Wisconsin faithfully and well in the performance of duties and has thus earned the commendation due an exemplary public employee:
