## ***Retirement Resolution***

Daniel B. Maxinoski will retire from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources on August 2, 2008 after serving more than thirty-four years with the State of Wisconsin.

On January 7, 1974, Max was selected to become a Conservation Warden. He was assigned training stations at Lancaster, Shawano, and Delafield. On July 8, 1974 he was assigned to the Marshfield warden station. Max fell in love with the Marshfield station and a girl named Jill. Max has spent his entire warden career in Marshfield.

Max was always eager to volunteer for special assignments. He enjoyed seeing all of the beauty that Wisconsin has to offer. Whether it was working waterfowl hunters on the Mississippi River, chasing fish spears, or working bear hunters, UP NORTH, he loved to see new country. Max has attended more than fifty such enforcement camps in his career.

Max's biggest asset was his punctuality. Being on time was a necessity with him. Max could often be heard chiding a tardy warden, "If you're not there ten minutes early, you're late."

Being the only Department employee in Marshfield, Max has an excellent working relationship with the Wood County Sheriff's Department, Marshfield Police Department, Fire Department, Park and Recreation Department and both City and County government. As someone once said "Max is a one man DNR gang in Marshfield."

Max has always remembered and strived to live by the words of wisdom his father said upon his appointment as a Conservation Warden: "Don't let the power of the badge go to your head, treat people right."
