### D. DNR Law Enforcement Update

Warden Rick Rosen

DISCUSSION

DNR Law Enforcement provided an update on the state of Law Enforcement in the Wisconsin Warden Service:

Bureau of Law Enf is now the Division of Public Safety & Resource Protection (1 of 6 divisions within the DNR)

- o Chief (Division Administrator) Casey Krueger
- o 2 Deputy Chiefs (Assistant Division Administrators) Matt O'Brien & Jeremy Peery
- Staffing Levels: Very good at the moment. Have filled or in process of filling numerous positions: EE specialists, investigators, policy officer, boating law administrator, marine enforcement unit supervisor, training director, recruitment and hiring director, business services manager, tactical officer and several new supervisors.
   New class of field wardens to be hired...background checks underway.
- Warden Experiences Lately (Burning the candle at both ends):
- o Outdoor activities and recreation property use is very high and a demanding workload. Wardens are celebrating the new outdoor energy spurred on by the pandemic, but lamenting the recent add-on work of traditional law enforcement such as deployments to civil unrest, capitol security and pandemic assignments such as protecting the strategic national stockpile supply warehouse and providing security at covid isolation centers. The Milw Bucks championship was one for the celebration books as well...but...the wardens were also pulled into public safety efforts due to the huge crowds. Wardens saved many folks that j
- o The Division will be doubling down efforts on life saving initiatives in water sports (boating & swimming) and recreational vehicle activities. Wardens have responded to numerous fatal and near fatal incidents this year.
- o During the pandemic wardens made every effort to cover field needs of other programs that were not allowed to do field work due to safety protocols put in place. This has decreased immensely now that other staff are allowed to get back in the field. The Governor and Secretary both recognized the extra efforts the wardens undertook during these unprecedented times. The Division of Public Safety and Resource Protection was exempted from hiring freezes which were in place for most programs. Great call...it kept efforts afloat! Other programs are now hiring and getting back up to full speed.
- · Wardens will be getting body cameras due to a recent budget initiative. Currently in the planning and development stages of setting up this program. Lots of Open Records and data storage logistics. Many legalities to iron out.
- · We are rolling out new computers to wardens. Their other computers are 5 years old, off warranty and starting to malfunction. This was good timing to make the move to another computer, similar in design and price...no particular upgrades really.
- Operation Budget: Status quo. Saved a lot of \$ when significant #'s of staff weren't traveling or incurring expenses during Covid; however, we are now nearly full staffed and will see where the rubber meets the road with a full contingent of Division staff.
- Salary Budget: OT hours will be cut somewhat...from 420 hours annually to 410 hours annually. We have a special account that was granted to the warden service many years ago from the legislature, but has never increased or

Jason Brazzalle: Offered exciting news - spoke about the High School Fishing Association - board meeting recently. Championship this year will be on Castlerock and Petenwell waters.
