



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
Public Hearing for Board Order Numbers: WA-11-21, WA-12-21 and WA-14-21

Hazardous waste regulations are under chs. NR 660 to 679, W.A.C.

- WI DNR is authorized by EPA to manage state RCRA program.
- State regulations must be analogous to federal hazardous waste regulations to maintain authorization.
- Section 291.05, Wis. Stats., requires the department to promulgate criteria identical to those created by EPA for identifying the characteristics of hazardous waste.
- Household hazardous waste is exempt from hazardous waste regulations (until collected).

Public Hearing for Board Order Number WA-11-21

Modernizing Ignitable Liquids Determination Federal Rule

Federal promulgation occurred July 7, 2020. Effective September 8, 2020.

- Updates outdated flash point test methods relating to ignitable hazardous waste determinations.
- Clarifies the definition of an aqueous solution.
- Corrects cross references to U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) regulations.

Key points




This revision allows for the use of:

- Modern equipment and techniques for making ignitability determinations for waste.
- Non-mercury thermometers for a variety of EPA's analytical methods that currently require mercury thermometers.
- Potentially reduces the use of mercury containing products which EPA estimates will decrease exposure to mercury.
- Defines "aqueous" to be at least 50 percent weight by water.
- Creates consistency between EPA language and U.S. DOT cross references.

Potential Impact and Impacted Entities

WA-11-21 Modernizing Ignitable Liquids Determinations



- Allows for modernization of equipment
- Approximately 18 certified & registered labs (currently performing test methods for ignitability) including HW licensed facilities with labs
- Potential reduced cost for repair and replacement of equipment, time savings
- Increase opportunity to remove mercury containing-equipment (lessen risk to human health and the environment)

Generators and Transporters

- Improved and clarified regulations
 - Potential time savings (labeling and shipment)

Universal Waste Revisions Federal Rule

Federal promulgation December 9, 2019. Effective February 7, 2020.

- Allows aerosol cans to be managed as a universal waste (optional).
- Clarifies destination facility requirements.
- Clarifies requirements for intentionally broken or crushed lamps:
 - Manage the broken/crushed materials as HW.
 - Manage the HW emissions and residues.



What is a Universal Waste? A conditionally Exempt Hazardous Waste

Exemptions: Allows a material that is a solid or hazardous waste to be partially or fully freed from RCRA requirements

*But you must follow applicable regulations or <u>all</u> hazardous waste regulations may apply




WA-12-21 Evaluating, Modifying and Expanding Universal Waste Regulations

- Universal waste regulations, found in ch. NR 673, Wis. Adm. Code, can relieve regulatory burden for the management of wastes that may be hazardous wastes.
- Universal waste regulations are designed to promote recycling, decrease monetary burdens, and ensure environmental protection and worker safety.

Potential Impact and Impacted Entities

WA-12-21 Evaluating, Modifying and Expanding Universal Waste Regulations

Aerosol Can management

- Impacted entities include a variety of small businesses, including retailers, auto body and repair shops, gas stations, printers and grocery stores; manufacturers that produce or use aerosols (ex. painting)
- Optional management standard (flexibility)
- Reduced management and disposal costs
- Potential for increased recycling

Destination facility language

- Impacted entities: UW recyclers (typically)
- No change to interpretation or facility obligations. Proposed code will continue to align with current state with federal requirements
- Clarified regulations specific to when a license is required

Crushed lamps

- Impacted entities: Will mostly impact bad actors
- Clarified regulations manage crushed lamps as HW
- Capture and manage residues including emissions

Preliminary Public Hearing for Board Order Number WA-14-21

Technical Corrections Update

- Corrects spelling, grammatical errors, and citation errors.
- Addresses missing or incorrect federal code language.
- Covers, in part, recent federal technical corrections.
- Clarifications (primarily within licensing NR 664/665/670 code).

Key Points

- Program missed previous (historic) federal corrections (ex. Checklist 214, Effective July 14, 2006) during most recent rule development.
- EPA released new technical corrections in the Federal Register on December 7, 2023.
- Spelling and grammatical errors identified in existing Wis. Adm. Code.

Example: 661.0033 chart for u-listed (commercial chemical products) has 4 entries listed as U<u>6</u>79. Two should be U<u>2</u>79. These are national standards and must be corrected to match federal listing.

Example: We maintain a federal to state crosswalk with our rule-numbering system. Federal 40 CFR 262 is equivalent to NR 662. However, WI rule-writing requirements create some issues:

- Last rule package required updates generated by federal changes to 262.11
- Revisions required WI numbering to 662.011
- 2020 HW rule package missed some of the required "0s"

Potential Impact and Impacted Entities

Reviewing entirety of the hazardous waste chapters, NR 660-679, Wis. Adm. Code.

Impacted entities include the regulated community
Rule corrects errors and does not impose new burdens on businesses

- Alleviate confusion and standardizes language to be consistent with federal regulations
- Clarifications do not change intent or legal meaning of existing regulations






